TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ON FOREIGN WARSHIPS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL WATERS OF CYPRUS.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Foreign Warships (Wireless Telegraphy) Law.

Interpretation.

2. In this Law—

“foreign warships” mean any men-of-war, other than British, and includes service aircraft accompanying them;

“wireless telegraphy” has the same meaning as in the Wireless Telegraphy Law.

Restriction on use of apparatus by foreign warship.

3. A person shall not work or use any apparatus for wireless telegraphy installed on a foreign warship whilst that ship is within the territorial waters of the Colony, otherwise than in accordance with rules made by the Admiralty from time to time, and notified in the Gazette, and with Regulations made in that behalf by the Governor in Council.
