### SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 116. THE BREWERIES LAWS, 1950 AND 1954.

LAWS 21 OF 1950 AND 22 OF 1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2909

MADE UNDER SECTION 12.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by the proviso to section 12 of the Breweries Laws, 1950 and 1954, His Excellency the Governor, 21 of 1950 with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as 22 of 1954 follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Breweries (Excise Duty) Order, 1957.
- 2. The rate of excise duty levied and paid upon beer manufactured and issued for consumption in the Colony under section 12 of the Breweries Laws, 1950 and 1954, is hereby increased from fifty mils on each gallon to one hundred mils on each gallon.
- 3. This Order shall come into force on the eleventh day of February, 1957.

# THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY LAWS, 1952 AND 1955.

#### REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

7 of 1952 37 of 1955. In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 6 of the Wireless Telegraphy Laws, 1952 and 1955, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Regulations, 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy Regulations, 1955 to 1957.

- 2. Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the words "five hundred mils" (line 3) of the words "one pound".
  - 3. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st March, 1957.
