## NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to the Administrator that it is desirable to establish a wireless transmitting station east of the Salt Lake and within the village of Akrotiri, in the Sovereign Base Area of Akrotiri, the cost whereof is to be borne by Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Ordinance, the Acting Administrator has been pleased to declare the establishment of the said wireless transmitting station to be an undertaking of public utility and has been pleased to authorise the carrying out of the said undertaking and to entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Engineer in charge British East Mediterranean Relay Station, Cyprus.

## NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to Notification No. 31 published in this Supplement, notice is hereby given that the following privileges are required to be acquired for the undertaking of public utility mentioned therein.

The privileges conferred upon the community of Akrotiri over that part of the Main State Forest of Akrotiri set out in the plan referred to in this Notice, which privileges were conferred under the terms of a Court settlement between the community and the Attorney - General of the Colonial Government following Action No. 667 of 1943 in the District Court of Limassol, which settlement was modified by an agreement between representatives of the community and the Legal Adviser to the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia dated 10th September 1963, namely the right to graze, cut, collect and dispose of reeds and other natural growth, the right to use and exploit water and the right to reclaim any part and extent of the land mentioned therein.

Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said privileges who objects to the acquisition is required within twenty days from the date of the publication of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and the evidence thereof, and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.

The engineer in charge British East Mediterranean Relay Station Cyprus is willing to treat for the acquisition of the said privileges.

A plan showing the land, about 153 donums in extent, affected by the privileges set out above is available for inspection at my office.

(EXPORT) REGULATIONS, 1956 to 1959.

## NOTICE UNDER REGULATIONS 20(h) AND 53(2).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 20(h) and 53(2) of the Agricultural Produce (Export) Regulations, 1956 to 1959, I hereby declare the following:—

- (a) grapes of the 1977 crop, intended for export as table grapes, shall be required before being harvested to be inspected at the place where they are grown by an Inspector and shall be selectively picked;
- (b) the minimum requirements of maturity of sultana grapes shall be 9 degrees Baume except where in the opinion of the Inspector other factors affect maturity;
- (c) the maturity and colour of other varieties of grapes intended for export shall be approved by the Inspector.
