THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND
IMPROVEMENT) ORDINANCE

(Cap. 243—Laws of Cyprus).

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD
OF EPISKOPI VILLAGE UNDER SECTION 24.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Ordinance, the Improvement Board of Episkopi hereby make the following Bye-Laws:—

1. These Bye-Laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Amendment) Episkopi Bye-Laws, 1990 and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Episkopi Bye-Laws, 1954 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as the “principal Bye-Laws.”).

2. Bye-Laws 185 of the principal Bye-Laws is hereby deleted and substituted by the following new Bye-Law:—

“185 (1) Every person who, within the improvement area, carries on, exercises or practises any scientific profession, business, commercial enterprise, craft or any other occupation shall, in every year, pay a tax in accordance with the following scale, as the Board may in each case determine.

(i) Labourers and other day-workers—

- (a) Who have no regular employment: £2;
- (b) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments do not exceed £1,500: £3;
- (c) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £1,500 and £2,000: £5;
- (d) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £2,000 and £2,500: £6;
- (e) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £2,500 and £3,000: £8;
- (f) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £3,000 and £3,500: £10;
- (g) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £3,500 and £4,000: £16;
- (h) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £4,000 and £5,000: £25;
- (i) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £5,000 and £6,000: £30;
- (j) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £6,000 and £8,000: £40;

- (k) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £8,000 and £10,000: £50;
 - (l) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are between £10,000 and £15,000: £70;
 - (m) Salaried employees whose annual emoluments are in excess of £15,000: £100.
- (ii) Professionals exercising liberal professions—
- (a) Farmers: not exceeding £15;
 - (b) Bakers, butchers, barbers, grocery-shop keepers, perishable sellers, kiosk-keepers, taxi-drivers, bus-drivers, building contractors, construction carpenters: not exceeding £40;
 - (c) Hotel-keepers, medical practitioners, chemists, advocates, merchants, manufacturers, proprietors of recreation centres, businessmen, architects and engineers: not exceeding £100;
 - (d) Corporate Bodies: not exceeding £200;
 - (e) Banks, insurance companies, also off-shore companies: not exceeding £300;
 - (f) Individuals or Companies keeping motor cars for hire: not exceeding £20 per motor car;
 - (g) Persons keeping either poultry, animal husbandry or dairy farms: not exceeding £100;
- (iii) Other persons not included in categories (a), (b) and (c) above: not exceeding £100.”.

3 Every tax payable as prescribed by this Bye-Law, shall be paid to the person authorised in that behalf by the Improvement Board.

4 In exercise of the powers vested in me under subsection (2) of Section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Ordinance, I the Chief Officer, hereby approve the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Amendment) Episkopi Bye-Laws, 1990 set out above.

THE LAND ACQUISITION ORDINANCE

(Cap. 226—Laws of Cyprus—and Ordinances 12 of 1963,
9 of 1964, 1 of 1986, 4 of 1987 and 19 of 1988).

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to Public Instrument No. 19 of 1990 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette No. 881 of the 5th March, 1990 notice is hereby given that the following communal property is required for the undertaking of the public utility mentioned therein.

The communal property, extending to 1 hectare, 3 decares and 600 square metres or thereabouts, represented by the area coloured red on the Government Survey Plan signed by the Officer entrusted with the supervision of the said undertaking, dated the 28th February, 1990 and deposited in the Area Office Phassouri, Sovereign Base Area Akrotiri, being part of the communal property known as Zakaki Merra.

Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said communal property, who objects to the acquisition, is required within twenty-one days from the date of the publication of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and of the evidence thereof and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.

The Administrator is willing to treat for the acquisition of the said communal property.
