SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION

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CONTROL OF WATER POLLUTION (DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES) REGULATIONS 2009

The Administrator makes the following Regulations in exercise of his powers under section 29 of the Control of Water Pollution Ordinance 2005(a) and section 28A of the Interpretation Ordinance(b).

Citation and Commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Water Pollution (Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2009 and come into force on the day that they are published in the Gazette.

Adoption of Republican public instrument No. 513/2002

2. The Control of Water Pollution (Pollution Caused by Certain Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2002(c) of the Republic, which came into force in the Republic on 25 October 2002, have effect in the Areas (so far as relevant) as if they had been made under section 29 of the Control of Water Pollution Ordinance 2005.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

1. This note relates to the Control of Water Pollution (Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2009 (“the Regulations”). It has been prepared by the Office of the Attorney General and Legal Adviser in order to assist the reader of the Regulations. It is not part of the Regulations.
2. Section 28A of the Interpretation Ordinance (Cap 1 as amended by Ordinance 37/03) provides that a power to make a public instrument includes a power to specify that the whole or part of a Republican public instrument is to have effect in the Areas subject to any specified exceptions, adaptations or modifications. Once it is specified that a Republican public instrument is to have effect in the Areas, that public instrument is an adopted instrument within the Adopted Instruments Ordinance 2003 (Ordinance 15/03 as amended by Ordinance 36/03).
3. The Regulations provide for a set of Republican Regulations (the Control of Water Pollution (Pollution Caused by Certain Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2002 (the “Republican Regulations”)) to have effect in the Areas in their original Republican format. The Republican Regulations apply to inland surface waters and inland coastal waters and are aimed at eradicating pollution caused by specified substances and at reducing pollution caused by certain other specified substances. The Republican Regulations implement Council Directive 76/464/EEC of 4 May 1976, regarding pollution of the aquatic environment caused by discharge of pollutants.
