ORDINANCE 4 OF 1967.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND THE HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

BE it enacted by the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Hours of Employment (Amendment) Ordinance, 1967, and shall be read as one with the Hours of Employment Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance").

Short title.
Cap. 182 (Laws of Cyprus).

2. The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting immediately after Section 3 thereof the following new sections, to be numbered 4 and 5 respectively:—

New Sections 4 and 5 added to principal Ordinance.

"Appointment of Inspectors.

4. The Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, may appoint Inspectors to assist in giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Right of entry of Inspectors appointed under this Ordinance and of certain police officers.

5.—(1) Any Inspector appointed under the provisions of Section 4 of this Ordinance and any police officer not below the rank of sergeant may-

(a) enter, inspect and examine at all reasonable hours by day or night

any premises and every part thereof if he has reasonable cause to believe that a person is employed therein in contravention of the provisions of this Ordinance:

Provided that he shall not enter a dwelling house without the written consent of the occupier unless a warrant has been issued to this effect by the Judge's Court;

(b) make such examination and inquiry as may be necessary to ascertain whether the provisions of this Ordinance are being complied with.

(2) Every occupier or person exercising control over the premises, as well as his agents and servants, shall render such assistance as may be necessary for the carrying out of such inspection, inquiry or examination.

(3) If any person wilfully delays or obstructs an Inspector or police officer in the exercise of the powers conferred by this section, such person shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding two months or to both such fine and imprisonment".
