**THE POWERS AND DUTIES
(OFFICERS OF THE REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS)
ORDINANCES 1960 AND 1961.**

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 9 of the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) Ordinance, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Amendment of Schedule) Order, 1965.

2. The Schedule to the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) Ordinance, is hereby amended by deleting the following Ordinances without prejudice to anything done thereunder:-

THE PRISON DISCIPLINE ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 4 of the Prison Discipline Ordinance, the Administrator has been pleased to make the following Regulations:-

Cap. 286 (Laws
of Cyprus).

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations 1965 and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by inserting immediately after regulation 82 thereof the following new regulation, to be numbered 82A:-

“Allowances. 82A.—(1) Prisoners before trial shall not be required to work in the service or workshops of the prison but may do so with their consent, and in that event shall be eligible for an allowance for work and good conduct at such rate or rates as may be fixed by the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, not exceeding the rates with which convicted prisoners are credited.

(2) Such allowances shall be subject to the same conditions as those applicable to convicted prisoners under regulation 101”.

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by inserting immediately after regulation 91 the following new regulation, to be numbered 91A:-

“Allowances. 91A. Debtors shall be eligible for an allowance for work and good conduct at the same rates and under the same conditions as those for convicted prisoners to whom regulation 101 applies.”.

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by repealing regulation 101 thereof and substituting therefor the following new regulation:-

“Allowances. 101.—(1) Convicted prisoners may be credited with an allowance for industry and for the full performance of the task allotted to them for the day accompanied by good conduct, at such rate as may be fixed from time to time by the Administrator:

Provided that the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, may specify—

- (a) that prisoners serving a sentence of less than a specified period, being not more than one month (hereinafter referred to as the “specified sentence”), shall not be eligible to be credited with an allowance as provided in this regulation; and
- (b) that prisoners who have not completed such part of their sentence as the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, may specify, being not more than one month (hereinafter referred to as the “specified period”), shall not be eligible to be cre-

dited with an allowance as provided in this regulation, until they have completed the specified period:

Provided further that cleaning of their own cells, washing of their own clothes or themselves, attendance for medical examination or treatment, attendance at lectures or other similar activities shall not, for the purposes of this regulation, be considered as an "allotted task":

Provided also that no allowance shall be credited in respect of Sundays, or of public or religious holidays, unless work on any such day has been performed for a minimum of four hours.

(2) No payments in cash shall be made to any convicted prisoner until his release from prison but such prisoner may, at the discretion of the Superintendent of Prisons, for good and sufficient reason, remit out of prison, through the prison authority, such sum of money standing to his credit as his property at the prison, as may be allowed by the Superintendent of Prisons.

(3) Convicted prisoners to whom this regulation applies may be allowed to purchase weekly through the prison authority such articles for their own use, not exceeding such cost, and subject to such conditions, as may be determined by the Superintendent of Prisons from time to time, the cost of such articles being debited against the prisoner's credited allowance.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 130, convicted prisoners to whom this regulation applies may be permitted to smoke at such times and at such places as may be authorised by the Superintendent of Prisons.

(5) The Superintendent of Prisons shall have power to stop any allowance or supply of articles under this regulation to any prisoner undergoing punishment for any offence against these regulations, or whose work or conduct is unsatisfactory, for such period as he may consider fit.

(6) Any convicted prisoner serving a sentence exceeding the specified sentence who has completed the specified period and who is unable to work by reason of some permanent disability or who is certified as sick or unfit for work by a Medical Officer may, by good conduct, be credited with an allowance at such rate per day as may be fixed by the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas,

not exceeding one third of the minimum rate payable to convicted prisoners. No allowance shall be credited in respect of Sundays, or of public or religious holidays.”

THE STAMP ORDINANCE

(Ordinance 13 of 1964).

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTIONS 12 (1) AND 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under subsection (1) of section 12 and section 61 of the Stamp Ordinance, 1964, the Administrator has been pleased to make the following regulations:-

1. These regulations may be cited as the Stamp Regulations, 1965.

2. The stamps to be used for the stamping of instruments chargeable under the provisions of the Stamp Ordinance shall be those stamps prescribed by the Adhesive Stamps (Printing and Use) Regulations 1963 of the Republic, and the stamps to be used for denoting payment of penalty payable under the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be the stamps prescribed for such use under the provisions of the Penalty (Denoting of Payment by a Special Stamp) Regulations, 1964 of the Republic.

THE LAND ACQUISITION ORDINANCE,

(Cap. 226 - Laws of Cyprus-
and Ordinances 12 of 1963 and 9 of 1964).

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 7.

Whereas by Public Instrument No. 50 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette No. 125 of 30th December 1964, the Administrator declared the acquisition of certain privately-owned land for the Officers' Married Quarter site at Royal Air Force Station Pergamos, to be an undertaking of public utility;

And whereas the Area Officer Dhekelia, in compliance with sub-section (1) of Section 6 of the Land Acquisition Ordinance, by Public Instrument No. 51 of 1964, gave particulars of the land required in connection with the said undertaking of public utility (hereinafter referred to as "the property");

And whereas the Area Officer Dhekelia, in compliance with sub-section (2) of the said section, forwarded to the Administrator the required recommendations, plan and particulars;

And whereas the Administrator has approved the plan and particulars submitted, having regard to the circumstances of the case, that the property be acquired:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 7 of the Land Acquisition Ordinance, the Administrator hereby sanctions the acquisition of the property under the provisions of the said Ordinance.
