**THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (EXPORT)
REGULATIONS, 1956 to 1959.**

NOTICE UNDER REGULATION 20 (d).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by paragraph (d) of Regulation 20 of the Agricultural Produce (Export) Regulations, 1956 to 1959, as applied to and adapted in the Areas by the Laws (Adaptation and Interpretation) Ordinance, 1960 to 1962, I, the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, hereby fix Monday, the 27th November, 1967, as the date for the commencement of the picking of the 1967/1968 oval oranges intended for export.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR UNDER
DEFENCE REGULATION 45.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 45, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, (as applied to and adapted in the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia by the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia Order in Council, 1960, and the Laws (Adaptation and Interpretation) Ordinances, 1960 to 1961), which Order continues in force by virtue of the provisions of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Continuation) Ordinance, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Navigation Order, 1967.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of Article 5 of this Order, no vessel may be in or go into, or be moved, navigated, or piloted in, or anchored, moored or berthed within that part of the territorial waters of the Sovereign Base Areas, described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the "Akrotiri controlled area") without permission of the authority specified in Article 3 of this Order given in the manner prescribed in this Order and subject, where appropriate, to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article.

(2) Any permission given, under this Article by the authority specified in Article 3 of this Order, for a specified vessel to be in, go into, or be moved, navigated or piloted in the Akrotiri controlled area, shall, unless it includes permission for the same vessel to be anchored, moored or berthed within the said area, be treated for the purposes of this Order, as being permission for the said vessel to be in, go into, or be moved, navigated or piloted in the said area, as the case may be, only for the purpose of movement in the course of uninterrupted innocent passage with reasonable speed.

3. The permission referred to in Article 2 of this Order may be given by the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to this Order.

4. Any permission given under Article 2 of this Order by the authority specified in Article 3 of this Order may be revoked at any time by the same authority.

5. This Order shall not apply to any vessel which is in, or goes into, or is moved or navigated or piloted in, or anchored, moored or berthed within the controlled area solely for the purpose of the discharge of oil cargoes from the submarine pipeline situated therein into shore tanks, or solely for the purpose of piloting or otherwise assisting another vessel otherwise exempt from this Order under this Article.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 2.

Cap. 213 (Laws
of Cyprus).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 2 of the Bombardment Range Areas Ordinance, the Administrator hereby declares the areas set out in the Schedule to this Notice to be Bombardment Range Areas for use by Her Majesty's Forces, until further notice, as practice areas for the purpose specified in the said Section.

2. Public Instrument No. 72 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette No. 88 of 14th December, 1963 in so far as it relates to the Episkopi Bombardment Range Area is hereby cancelled, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

The area of the territorial waters of the Sovereign Base Areas bounded by a line drawn round the circumference of a circle of 4,000 yards radius with a centre in the position 34° 38' 00" N, 32° 51' 40" E and by the limit of the territorial waters where that limit is within the area of the aforesaid circle.

The area of the territorial waters of the Sovereign Base Areas bounded by a line drawn round the circumference of a circle of 2,000 yards radius with a centre in the position 34° 37' 40" N, 32° 48' 03" E.

THE COMMODITIES AND SERVICES
(REGULATION AND CONTROL) ORDINANCE
(Ordinances 11 of 1962, 9 of 1963 and 3 of 1967).

CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICE ORDER
MADE UNDER SECTIONS 3 (1) and 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by subsection (1) of section 3 and section 4 of the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) Ordinance, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) (Maximum Price) Order, 1967.
2. In this Order—
 “maximum price” means the maximum wholesale or retail price, as the case may be, at which the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order were sold on the 17th November, 1967.
3. The price at which the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be sold or offered for sale, whether wholesale or retail, shall not exceed the maximum price.
