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## THE PRISONS ORDINANCE

(Ordinance 11 of 1971).

NOTICE ISSUED UNDER SECTION 12 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, I, the Superintendent, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby declare as follows:—

1. (a) The provisions of the Police (Discipline) Regulations, 1967, set out in the first column of Part I of Appendix I hereto with the modifications set out in the second column of the said Part of the said Appendix; and
- (b) the provisions of the Prisons (Prison Service) Regulations set out in the second column of Part II of Appendix I hereto with the modifications set out in the third column of the said Part of the said Appendix,

shall apply to and in relation to the service of prison officers.

2. The provisions of the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, set out in the first column of Appendix II hereto shall, with the modifications set out in the second column of the said Appendix, apply to and in relation to the service of prison officers.

The provisions of the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, set out in the first column of the Appendix hereto shall, with the modifications set out in the second column of the said Appendix, apply to the service and to matters appertaining to the service of police officers who are appointed or revert to their appointments as prison officers, or to the service or to matters appertaining to the service of prison officers who are appointed or revert to their appointments as police officers as if they had remained in one service.

The rank of warder in the Prison Service shall be equivalent to the rank of constable in the Police Force and the rank of sergeant warder in the Prison Service shall be equivalent to the rank of sergeant in the Police Force for the purposes of the Police Ordinance, 1967 and the Prisons Ordinance, 1971 and of all Regulations made under either of the said Ordinances.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, I, the Superintendent, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby declare as follows:—

The Police (Promotion) Regulations, 1967, which apply to the qualification for promotion and the promotion of police officers shall in addition apply to the simultaneous qualification for promotion and the simultaneous promotion of police and prison officers of the ranks of constable and constable warder to the ranks of sergeant in the Force and sergeant warder in the Service, as if such regulations were modified in the manner set out in the Appendix hereto.

## THE PRISONS ORDINANCE

(Ordinance 11 of 1971).

## REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 15 (2).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, I, the Chief Police Officer and the Superintendent, with the approval of the Administrator, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (Combined Service) (Discipline and General) Regulations, 1971.

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires :—

“due process” means due process under the provisions of the Disciplinary Regulations appropriate to the prescribed service concerned;

“officer” means a police officer or a prison officer;

“prescribed service” means the Force or the Service.

(2) Subject to paragraph (1) of this regulation and unless the context otherwise requires, words or expressions contained in these regulations shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Police Ordinance, 1967, and in the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, or in any Ordinances amending or substituted for the same.

3.—(1) If the appointment of any officer in one of the two prescribed services is terminated by dismissal or requirement to resign on grounds of misconduct after due process, the appointment, if any, of such officer in the other prescribed service shall be treated as having been automatically terminated by dismissal or requirement to resign, as the case may be, without any further process or enquiry or further action by the officer concerned.

(2) If an officer in one of the two prescribed services is reduced to a lower rank for misconduct after due process, any rank higher than constable or warder which he holds in the other prescribed service shall be automatically reduced to an equivalent lower rank without further process or enquiry.

(3) If a police officer who is also a prison officer is discharged from the Force on grounds of inefficiency as a police officer, he shall be treated as having been automatically discharged from the Service on grounds of inefficiency as a prison officer without any further process or enquiry.

(4) If a prison officer who is also a police officer is discharged from the Service for inefficiency as a prison officer, he shall be treated as having been automatically discharged from the Force on grounds of inefficiency as a police officer without further process or enquiry if his terms of service as a police officer provide that this paragraph of this regulation shall apply to his police service.

(5) Without prejudice to the provisions of paragraphs (3) and (4) of this regulation, in considering the possible discharge on grounds of inefficiency as a police officer and a prison officer

of an officer who has been employed in both prescribed services, the Chief Police Officer and the Superintendent may act jointly and may assess the quality of the combined performance of such officer in both prescribed services during the whole of his public service.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of any regulations or other statutory instruments, no officer shall be paid any salary or be eligible for any gratuity, good conduct or merit allowance in respect of any public service in one of the two prescribed services for or in respect of which he has been paid any salary, gratuity or allowance of the same amount, for or in relation to his public service during the same period of time in the other prescribed service:

Provided that where during the same period of time any officer has served in both prescribed services in ranks which are not equivalent to each other, his salary gratuity or allowances for or in respect of such period shall be assessed as if he had served only in the higher paid rank.

5.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Police and Prison Officers (Promotion) Regulations, 1971, any warder who is also a sergeant or a constable in the Force and who qualified professionally as a sergeant before the date of the coming into force of these Regulations, may, before being promoted to the rank of sergeant warder, or in the case of a constable to the rank of sergeant, be required by the Superintendent or the Chief Police Officer, as the case may be, to qualify professionally as a sergeant warder by obtaining 50% of marks in each subject and 60% of total marks in a special examination consisting of prison service subjects only, or may, at the discretion of the Superintendent, be exempted from such examination.

(2) Any warder, who is also a sergeant in the Force, to whom paragraph (1) of this regulation applies, and who qualifies professionally under the provisions of that paragraph as a sergeant warder or is exempted from such examination by the Superintendent, may be promoted to that rank by the Superintendent without any appearance before or recommendation by a Selection Board.

(3) The special examination in prison service subjects held under the provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation may, if the Superintendent thinks fit, be conducted orally.

(4) Nothing in this regulation or any other regulations shall affect the appointment and rank of any prison officer appointed before the enactment of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971.

THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967  
(Ordinances 9 of 1967 and 14 of 1969).

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REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 9.

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In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, I, the Chief Police Officer, with the approval of the Administrator, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 1971, and shall be read as one with the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 10 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting in paragraph (2) thereof the words and figure "regulation 9 of these Regulations" and substituting therefor the words "this regulation".

3. Without prejudice to any Ordinance or any other Public Instrument, the principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting regulation 45 thereof.

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THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS PROTECTION  
ORDINANCE

(Cap. 65—Laws of Cyprus—and Ordinances 19 of 1961,  
17 of 1962, 19 of 1964 and 6 of 1966).

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ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 5A.

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In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 5A of the Game and Wild Birds Protection Ordinance, I, the Chief Officer, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Game and Wild Birds Protection (Maximum Number of Game) Order, 1971.

2. The number of game that may be shot by the holder of a game licence on any one day shall not exceed one hare and six partridges or one hare, four partridges and two francolins.
