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THE POLICE ORDINANCE

(Ordinances 9 of 1967 and 14 of 1969).

RULES MADE UNDER SECTION 38 (3).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Administrator by section 38 of the Police Ordinance and by the same section as modified by the Third Schedule to the Prison Ordinance, I, the Administrator's Deputy hereby make the following Rules :—

Ordinance
No. 11 of 1971.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Sovereign Base Areas Police and Prison Officers' Association Rules, 1972.

2. The Sovereign Base Areas Police and Prison Officers' Association (in these Rules referred to as "the Association") shall consist of all police officers of the Force below the rank of Deputy Chief Police Officer and all prison officers below the rank of Assistant Superintendent and the Association shall act through the committees as hereinafter provided.

3.—(1) Separate general meetings of the constables and sergeants in each Area, and of the prison warders, to be known as the annual general meetings, may be held each year in June on dates to be fixed by the Chief Police Officer.

(2) Extraordinary general meetings shall be held on the direction of the Chief Police Officer on dates to be specified, or may be held with the consent of the Chief Police Officer at the request of a committee or of one half of the number of constables or sergeants in an Area or of the prison warders :

Provided that at an extraordinary general meeting only such matters as shall be specified in the agenda shall be discussed.

4. There shall be constituted three committees, one for constables and warders, one for sergeants and the sergeant warden and one for Inspectors, to be called the "constables' committee", the "sergeants' committee" and the "Inspectors' committee" respectively.

5.—(1) The constables' committee shall consist of two constables for each Area elected by the police constables belonging to that Area and one warden elected by the warders appointed for prison duties.

(2) The sergeants' committee shall consist of one sergeant for each Area elected by the police sergeants belonging to that Area and the sergeant warden appointed for prison duties who shall be *ex officio* a member of the sergeants' committee.

(3) The Inspectors' committee shall consist of one Inspector selected by mutual agreement by the Inspectors.

6. All constables and sergeants, other than the sergeant warden, in each Area and all prison warders shall have the right to vote at an election of the Area or prison representatives on the committee for their respective ranks.

7. The elections shall take place biennially in June on a day fixed by the Chief Police Officer and the annual meetings of all committees shall be held not later than the 14th day of July each year on a day fixed by the Chief Police Officer.

8. The three committees, or any two of them, may by agreement sit together as one committee to be known as the "Joint Committee" for any special purpose or regularly for all purposes of common interest.

9.—(1) A committee, or the joint committee, may submit representations in writing to the Chief Police Officer or to the Administrator through the Chief Police Officer.

(2) A committee, or the joint committee, shall consider and report upon any matter referred to it by the Chief Police Officer.

10. A committee, or the joint committee, in addition to submitting any representation to the Chief Police Officer or the Administrator may submit it also to the Secretary of State through the normal channels.

11. At any election conducted under these Rules the Deputy Chief Police Officer of the Area and the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons shall supervise the election and shall appoint two members of the rank in respect of which the election is held or two prison warders as the case may be to assist them in counting the votes and after all votes have been counted shall announce the names of those elected. In the event of any objection being raised as to the conduct of the election the Deputy Chief Police Officer or the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons may, if he is satisfied that the objection is valid, declare the election void and order a new election. The decision of the Deputy Chief Police Officer or the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons in this matter shall be final.

12. All candidates in any election shall signify to the Deputy Chief Police Officer or the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons before the election that they are willing to stand and their names shall then be placed on the ballot papers. Each elector shall then be given one ballot paper and no more on which he shall signify with an "X" the name or names of the candidates whom he wishes to elect up to the number provided for each Area and the prison warders in Rule 5. Any ballot paper which contains any other marks shall be invalid and shall be destroyed at the count. All elections shall be by secret ballot.

13. Any constable, warden or sergeant who is unable to be present at an election on account of sickness or absence from the Island of Cyprus on duty or leave may cause to be given to the Deputy Chief Police Officer of the Area or the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons, in a closed envelope, on or before the date of the election, the names of those whom he wishes to elect and, provided such names are included in the list of candidates on the ballot papers, the Deputy Chief Police Officer or the

Assistant Superintendent of Prisons shall cause them to be counted in the ballot. Any such names not included in the list of candidates shall be erased by the Deputy Chief Police Officer or the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons at the count.

14. Subject to the provisions of these Rules the constables' committee and the sergeants' committee may make regulations as to the mode of election of the members of the committee and as to the filling of casual vacancies among such members :

Provided that when the membership of a committee or of the joint committee falls below half its full membership the Chief Police Officer shall have the power to order new elections.

15. Each committee and the joint committee shall choose its chairman and secretary from among its members.

16. Subject to the provisions of these Rules every committee or the joint committee may regulate its own procedure including the appointment of sub-committees.

17. The chairman at any meeting of the committee or the joint committee at which he is present shall have a second or casting vote.

18. Committees may hold four quarterly meetings (including the annual meeting) at such place as may be convenient, but additional meetings for any special purpose may be held with the consent of the Chief Police Officer :

Provided that the members of the sergeants' and constables' committees for either Area may meet from time to time and with the approval of the Chief Police Officer :

- (a) to discuss any matter which is within the powers given to them by these Rules and the Ordinance ; and
- (b) under the chairmanship of the Deputy Chief Police Officer to discuss and make recommendations affecting welfare and sport within such Area and may, for this purpose, co-opt not more than two members of the Force or prison warders from the same Area.

19.—(1) The Association may raise funds by subscriptions among its members, and may collect subscriptions from its members to meet its expenses. Donations shall be accepted only from members of the Association.

(2) The rate of subscription payable by the members shall be decided at the Annual General Meeting.

(3) The committee shall keep detailed accounts of any subscriptions or donations paid to it and shall have these audited by an independent auditor. An annual statement of account shall be available at the Annual General Meeting. The Administrator or the Chief Police Officer may at any time ask for a copy of such statements of account or for any books kept in connection with the affairs of the Association.

(4) The funds of the Association shall not be used for contributing directly or indirectly to—

- (a) the funds of a trade union ;
- (b) the funds of a political party ;
- (c) the election expenses of a candidate for any election outside the Force or Service ;
- (d) the funds of any body or organisation outside the Force or Service ;
- (e) benevolent or charitable expenses except with the express approval of the Administrator ;
- (f) defray any expenses incurred by or on behalf of any member of the Force or Service in respect of any criminal or disciplinary proceedings against him.

(5) The funds of the Association may be used—

- (a) to pay expenses incurred in connection with meetings of the Association ;
- (b) to pay expenses incurred by representatives in attending meetings of an Association committee which are not chargeable to public funds ;
- (c) for such other purpose as the Chief Police Officer may approve.

20. Except where, in special circumstances, a police or prison officer is required for duty for which no substitute is available leave shall be given for attendance at meetings of the Association and its committees, and every such attendance, as regards allowance and expenses, shall be deemed to be an occasion of police or prison duty.

21. Meetings of the Association or any of its committees shall not be open to members of the public or to the press.

22. The Sovereign Base Areas Police Association Rules, 1966, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

THE MOTOR VEHICLES REGULATIONS, 1959 to 1967.

APPOINTMENT OF PERSONS TO EXERCISE POWERS

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ORDINANCE

(Cap. 45 - Laws of Cyprus and Ordinances
3 and 6 of 1969).

GENERAL ORDERS AND REGULATIONS MADE UNDER
SUBSECTIONS (1) AND (2) OF SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by subsections (1) and (2) of Section 4 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, the Administrator hereby makes the following General Orders and Regulations :—

1. These General Orders and Regulations may be cited as the Contagious Diseases (Animals)(Amendment) General Orders and Regulations, 1972 and shall be read as one with the Contagious Diseases (Animals) General Orders and Regulations as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal General Orders and Regulations").

2. Regulation 26H of the principal General Orders and Regulations is hereby amended by deleting in the fifth line thereof the word "treated" and substituting therefor the words "examined on payment of a fee of 500 mils".

3. The principal General Orders and Regulations are hereby amended by inserting immediately after regulation 26H thereof the following new Order and Regulation to be numbered 26I :

"26I. For the purpose of preventing the spreading of hydatosis, the Chief Officer may by notice published in the Gazette require the owner or person in charge of any bitch to bring such bitch to a veterinary station or any other place designated for the purpose by the Chief Officer in order that it may be sterilised by the appropriate authorities."
