REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 15  
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971, READ WITH SECTION 9  
OF THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967, AND SECTION 12  
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.

---

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I, the Chief Police Officer with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations :

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison (Promotion) Regulations, 1974 and shall, where they apply to the Police (Promotion) Regulations, 1967, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations", be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (Promotion) Regulations, 1967 as modified by Public Instrument No. 64 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. Regulation 11 of the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations are each amended by—

- (i) deleting in each case paragraph (2) thereof and substituting therefore in each the following new paragraph :

"(2) A candidate who fails to obtain not less than 50% of marks in any one subject in the professional group shall be required to be re-examined in all subjects in that group.";

- (ii) inserting immediately after paragraph (2) thereof the following new paragraph to be numbered (2A) :

"(2A) Without prejudice to the provisions of paragraph 2 of this regulation a candidate who fails to obtain not less than 50% of marks in any subjects in the education group of the examination shall not be required to sit for the whole examination in that group again if—

- (i) he has succeeded in the remaining subject or subjects with a minimum mark of 60% if successful in only one subject or a minimum aggregate of 60% and a minimum mark of 50% in each subject if successful in two or more subjects ; and

- (ii) he succeeds in re-examination in the subject or subjects in which he failed, within two years following upon his failure, with a minimum mark of 60% if re-examined in only one subject or a minimum aggregate of 60% and a minimum mark of 50% in each subject if re-examined in two or more subjects.”.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I, the Chief Police Officer with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations :

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 1974, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations", be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No. 60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. The Third Schedule to the principal Police Regulations and the Third Schedule to the principal Prison Officers Regulations is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :

- (a) Class "A" allowance is payable for cars of an engine capacity of 1101 c. c. and over.
- (b) Class "B" allowance is payable for cars of an engine capacity of 1100 c. c. and below.
- (c) Class "C" allowance is payable to a police officer using a motor cycle, whose regular travelling is confined within a radius of 10 miles from his station or the nature of whose duties is such as to require the use of a motor cycle and whose salary scale does not exceed £834 p. a.
- (d) When making out travelling claims police officers shall show on the claim the accumulative total of mileage since the beginning of a calendar year.

3. These Regulations shall be deemed to be effective from 1st January, 1973.
