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THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS (PROTECTION AND
DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974

(Ordinance No. 11 of 1974).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 26.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2 and 26 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974, the Administrator has prescribed that the periods specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a close season in addition to the close season as defined in section 2 of the Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

- (a) The period between 1st October, 1976 and 30th October, 1976, both days inclusive.
 - (b) The period between 27th December, 1976 and 31st December, 1976.
 - (c) All days in the week during a non-close season except Wednesdays and Sundays.

THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS (PROTECTION AND
DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974

(Ordinance No. 11 of 1974).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 6 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974, I, the Chief Officer, hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Game (Ceiling) Order, 1976.
2. The number of game that may be shot by the holder of a game licence on any one day shall not exceed two hares and five partridges, or two hares, four partridges and one francolin.

(Ordinance No. 11 of 1974).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 30.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 30 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974, I hereby declare the whole of Dhekalia Sovereign Base Area (other than the area already declared as a Game Reserve under Public Instrument No. 58 of 1969) to be a temporary game reserve for the period beginning on 31st October 1976 and ending on the 27th December, 1976.

THE SOCIAL INSURANCE (FACILITATION OF
REPUBLICAN SOCIAL INSURANCE SCHEME)
ORDINANCE

(Ordinances 17 of 1972, 8 of 1974 and 6 of 1976).

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 12.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 12 of the Social Insurance (Facilitation of Republican Social Insurance Scheme) Ordinance, 1972, the Chief Officer hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Contributions) (Special) Regulations, 1976.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“employed person” means a male or female domestic servant usually employed by two or more employers in the same contribution week;

“insurance office” means a Labour and Social Insurance Office existing at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations or an Area Office.

(2) Expressions not otherwise defined in these Regulations shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meaning assigned to them by the Social Insurance (Facilitation of Republican Social Insurance Scheme) Ordinance.

3.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (3) of section 4 of the Ordinance, any employed person shall be liable for the payment into the Fund not only of his own contribution under subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance but also of the contribution payable by his employer.

(2) The employer shall pay to any employed person the contribution payable under subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance at the time of payment of his wages during the contribution week in respect of which the contribution is payable.

(3) Where any employed person is employed by more than one employer in the same contribution week, the contribution payable by each employer under paragraph (2) of this Regulation shall be calculated in the proportion which the amount of wages he has paid to the employed person bears to the total wages earned by the employed person during that contribution week or in any other proportionate method.

4. Upon application in writing on the prescribed form giving his name, the Social Insurance number, the number of his identity card and any other information which may be demanded by the Chief Officer, an employed person shall be supplied with a contribution booklet.

5. An employed person shall, at the time of payment of his wages during any contribution week, produce to his employer the contribution booklet and shall acknowledge in the prescribed column thereof the receipt of any wages paid to him and of the contribution paid by the employer under these Regulations.

6. The employer shall record in the contribution booklet of any employed person the wages of the employed person for every day of the week and any other information which may be required by the Chief Officer and shall affix his signature in the prescribed column thereof.

7. Every contribution which any employed person is liable to pay under regulation 3 of these Regulations shall be paid within one month from the end of the contribution month which includes the contribution week in respect of which the contribution is payable.

8.—(1) The contributions payable under regulation 7 of these Regulations shall be paid at such insurance office as the Chief Officer may determine.

(2) Upon every payment of contributions an employed person shall produce the contribution booklet properly completed as required under regulation 6 of these Regulations.

9. On the expiry of the contribution booklet, an employed person shall, within a month of such expiry, deliver the contribution booklet to the insurance office where he last paid contributions and, if his employment as an employed person continues, he shall apply for a new contribution booklet.

10. Regulations 3, 4 and 6 of the Social Insurance (Contributions) Regulations, 1973 shall apply to persons to whom the provisions of these Regulations are applicable.

11.—(1) Any contributions which an employer is required to pay under the Annual Holidays with Pay Ordinance, 1973 and the Termination of Employment Ordinance, 1967 in respect of an employed person to whom these Regulations are applicable, shall be paid to the employed person at the time prescribed in paragraph (2) of Regulation 3 of these Regulations.

(2) The contributions referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation shall be paid by an employed person to the Funds referred to in the aforesaid Ordinances at the time of payment by him of the contribution referred to in paragraph (1) of the said regulation 3 during the contribution week in respect of which such contributions are payable.

12. When an employed person has acknowledged on any contribution booklet the receipt of any amount paid as provided in Regulation 5 of these Regulations it shall be presumed, unless the contrary is proved, that the employer has paid the employed person and the latter has received from the employer the contributions referred to in Regulations 3 and 11 of these Regulations.

13. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 12 of these Regulations, on payment to an employed person of the contribu-

tions referred to in Regulations 3 and 11 of these Regulations, the employer shall not be liable to pay such contributions to the respective Funds.

14. These Regulations shall come into force on the 4th October, 1976.
