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THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS
(PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE

(Ordinance 11 of 1974).

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 27 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 27 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, the Area Officer Akrotiri, with the approval of the Chief Officer, hereby authorises any holder of a valid game licence to shoot, take or pursue turtle-doves, wood pigeons, rock-pigeons, and other wild birds including such vermin as sparrows, crows, magpies, jackdaws and foxes, in the area set out in the Schedule hereto during the period commencing on the 7th August 1977 and ending on the 28th February 1978, subject to the following terms and conditions :—

- (a) shooting shall take place between sunrise and sunset only ;
- (b) there shall be no shooting within 200 yards of any Service installations or within 100 yards of the perimeter of the RAF Station Akrotiri ;
- (c) no fires shall be kindled ;
- (d) there shall be no shooting within 300 yards of Akrotiri village built-up area or in any private fenced up land ;
- (e) no farm or other cultivated land where there is a risk of damage being caused to fruit trees, vegetable gardens, citrus plantations, cereal crops or vineyards shall be entered ;
- (f) hunters shall carry with them their game licence, their gun possession licence and the certificate of registration of their gun ;
- (g) no dogs shall be used in the area north or south of the M. 1 road extending southwards as far as the coast line and the locality known as Upper Marsh ("Pano Livadhi").

SCHEDULE

All that area in the Akrotiri Sovereign Base Area which lies south of the Limassol — Paphos trunk road up to the junction of the Curium beach road and thence south east of the road in question, with the exception of any game reserves which lie within the said area.

THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971

(Ordinance 11 of 1971).

THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967

(Ordinances 9 of 1967, 14 of 1969 and 7 of 1975).

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 15
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971, READ WITH SECTION 9
OF THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967, AND SECTION 12 OF
THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I, the Chief Police Officer and Superintendent of Prisons, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations :

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 1977, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations", be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No. 60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. Regulation 7 of the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations are hereby amended by deleting in each case sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (2) thereof and substituting therefor the following new sub-paragraph :

"(c) on conviction in respect of an offence for dishonesty or immorality or in respect of an offence for which imprisonment exceeding six months is applicable :

Provided that prior to his discharge under sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph, the member of the Force or Service shall be entitled to present his case for hearing by the Chief Police Officer and Superintendent of Prisons."

3. The Second Schedule to the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations is hereby deleted and the following substituted thereof :

4. The Third Schedule to the principal Police Regulations and the Third Schedule to the principal Prison Officers Regulations is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :

- (a) Class “A” allowance is payable for cars of an engine capacity of 1101 c.c. and over.
- (b) Class “B” allowance is payable for cars of an engine capacity of 1100 c.c. and below.
- (c) Class “C” allowance is payable to a police officer using a motor cycle, whose regular travelling is confined within a radius of 10 miles from his station or the nature of whose duties is such as to require the use of a motor cycle.
- (d) When making out travelling claims police officers shall show on the claim the accumulative total of mileage since the beginning of a calendar year.
- (e) The above rates are abated by 5 miles per mile if the insurance for the vehicle is limited to Third Party only”.

5. These Regulations shall be deemed to be effective from 1st October, 1976.
