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THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS
(PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974

(Ordinance 11 of 1974).

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 27 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of Section 27 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, the Area Officer Akrotiri, with the approval of the Chief Officer, hereby authorises any holder of a valid game licence to shoot, take or pursue wood pigeons, rock-pigeons, quail and other wild birds, including such vermin as sparrows, crows, jackdaws and foxes, in the areas set out in the Schedule hereto during the period commencing on the 6th January, 1980 and ending on the 24th February, 1980 subject to the following terms and conditions:—

- (a) shooting in Area 'A' of the Schedule shall take place on Sundays and Wednesdays only ;
- (b) shooting in Area 'B' of the Schedule may take place daily ;
- (c) no dogs shall be used ;
- (d) no fires shall be kindled ;
- (e) no farm or other cultivated land where there is a risk of damage being caused to fruit trees, vegetable gardens, citrus plantations, cereal crops or vineyards shall be entered ;
- (f) shot-guns shall be carried from and to the areas specified in this notice dismantled ;
- (g) hunters shall carry with them their game licence, their gun possession licence and the certificate of registration of their gun.

2. This notice may be revoked at any time.

SCHEDULE**AREA 'A'**

The area commences at boundary pillar 37 north of the Limassol-Paphos road and west of Paramali Station; thence it runs along the SBA boundary up to boundary pillar 86; thence in a southerly direction along the Sotira-Episkopi track up to the boundary of the Game Reserve, known as Episkopi Garrison game reserve, and described in P. I. No. 92 of 1976 and along the said boundary up to the point of commencement.

AREA 'B'

The area commences at boundary pillar 117 north of the Curium beach road junction; thence it runs along the SBA boundary in a north westerly direction up to boundary pillar 86 east of the Episkopi-Sotira track; thence it runs in a southerly direction along the said track up to the Limassol-Paphos trunk road, excluding any game reserve areas; thence along the said Limassol-Paphos road up to the point of commencement.

THE TAX COLLECTION ORDINANCE

(Ordinance 8 of 1964).

WARRANT UNDER SECTION 5(1).

To the
Fiscal Officer
and all Tax Collectors,

I, Philip Goodrich Adams, Chief Officer, hereby require you and command you to proceed with the collection of the under-mentioned taxes which have become due and payable or may hereafter become due and payable during the year ending 31st December 1980, from all persons liable thereto and in default of payment to take such other steps against the defaulters as may be necessary for the recovery of the amounts in default under the provisions of the Tax Collection Ordinance.

All amounts assessed or imposed under the provisions of :—

- (a) Section 17 of the Streets and Buildings Regulation Ordinance, Cap. 96, as amended by Law No. 14 of 1959 and Ordinances Nos. 23 of 1961, 29 of 1963, 16 of 1964, 5 of 1974 and 10 of 1978 ;

- (c) Section 90 of the Elementary Education Ordinance, Cap. 166 ;

- (g) Sections 8 and 9 (3) of the Rural Constables Ordinance, Cap. 287, as amended by Ordinance No. 25 of 1963 ;
- (h) Sections 35 and 36 of the Estate Duty Ordinance, Ordinance No. 6 of 1965, as amended by Ordinance No. 13 of 1968 and Ordinance No. 7 of 1976 ;
- (i) Sections 37 and 45 of the Income Tax Ordinance, Cap. 323, as amended by Ordinance No. 16 of 1961 and Ordinance No. 11 of 1966 ;

- (j) Section 29 of the Public Waterworks Ordinance, Cap. 341 as amended by Ordinance No. 4 of 1969 ;
- (k) any rules made under Section 17 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Ordinance, Cap. 342, or Section 21 of the same Ordinance ;

THE PUBLIC ROADS (PROTECTION) ORDINANCE

(Cap. 83 and 2 of 1960 — Laws of Cyprus —
Ordinance 27 of 1961).

AUTHORISATION UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 9 of the Public Roads (Protection) Ordinance and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Chief Officer, Sovereign Base Areas, hereby further amend the Schedule to Public Instrument No. 77 of 1978 by deleting Part II thereof (published as Public Instrument No. 82 of 1979) and substituting therefor the following new Part II:—

THE MOTOR VEHICLES (CONTROL OF USE)
ORDINANCE, 1979

(Ordinance 5 of 1979).

ORDER MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Administrator by Section 3 of the Motor Vehicles (Control of Use) Ordinance, 1979 the Acting Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Private Motor Vehicles (Restriction and Regulation of Circulation) (Control of Petroleum) Order, 1980.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“private motor vehicle” has the meaning defined in Regulation 2 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations, 1973 ;

“week-end” means the period between 18.00 hours on each Saturday and 05.00 hours the following Monday.

3. With effect from 12th January, 1980 private motor vehicles may only circulate during week-ends in accordance with whether their registration numbers end with a number that is even or odd. During the week-end beginning 12th January, 1980 only private motor vehicles with even registration numbers may circulate. The following week-end commencing 19th January, 1980 private motor vehicles with odd registration numbers may circulate, and so on alternately each succeeding week-end, as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. The circulation of private motor vehicles during week-ends other than those prescribed in paragraph 3 is prohibited.

5. The circulation of private motor vehicles enumerated in the First Schedule hereto are exempted from the restrictions imposed under this Order.

6. Public Instruments Nos. 65 and 69 of 1979 are hereby revoked.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Paragraph 5).

1. Private motor vehicles of the Republic of Cyprus or any Republican semi-government organisation carrying clear markings of the service to which they belong, and carrying a certificate issued under proper authority that they circulate for official reasons.

2. Private motor vehicles owned and driven by tourists coming from abroad.

3. Private motor vehicles of doctors, midwives, veterinary surgeons and pharmacists on professional duty, in their normal area of practice, without any passengers who do not share the said professions, save as may be provided for by special certificate as set out in paragraph 7 hereunder and which carry on their windscreens a clear marking of the profession of the owner.

4. Private motor vehicles which carry perishable goods and fruit to the markets, or for export, animals for slaughtering to the slaughter houses, meat, fish and other foodstuffs to the markets as well as those which carry milk and bread in the normal course of trade.

5. Private motor vehicles of persons occupied in week-end duties which circulate to and from their place of work, without any passengers who do not share the same profession.

6. Private motor vehicles of Republican public officers and Crown Servants and servants of authorised service organisations as long as they circulate for public reasons, and carry a certificate to this effect issued under proper authority.

7. Private motor vehicles which may be granted a special certificate by the Administrator.

8. Motor-cycles, motor bicycles, auto-cycles, agricultural tractors, motor tractors and mobile motor cranes.

ORDINANCE, 1976**

(Ordinance 4 of 1976).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Administrator by Section 3 of the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1976, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Acting Administrator hereby makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) (Amendment) Order, 1980 and shall be read as one with the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) Order, 1976 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ORDINANCE

(Cap. 45 — Laws of Cyprus —
Ordinances 3 of 1969 and 6 of 1969).

ORDER MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTIONS 3, 4 AND 7.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Administrator by Sections 3, 4 and 7 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, the Acting Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

P. I. No. 80/78.

1. This Order may be cited as the Brucellosis (Amendment) Order, 1980 and shall be read as one with the Brucellosis Order, 1978 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”).

2. The principal Order is hereby amended:—

(a) by inserting in paragraph 2 thereof in their proper alphabetical order, the following new definitions:

“infected animal” means any animal which following special investigation has been found to be suffering from brucellosis;

“infected flock or infected herd” means a flock of goats and sheep or a herd of any other kind of animals, in which infected animals have been traced and which shall be deemed to be so infected until the lapse of four consecutive negative examinations over a period of at least six months following the last examination at which the infected animals were traced.”;

(b) by deleting paragraph 6 thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph:—

“6. If during the examination of a flock or herd a high percentage of infection has been traced or other circumstances are such that, in the opinion of the Chief Officer, they may lead to a rapid spreading of the disease, then all the animals of that flock or herd may be regarded as being infected animals and the procedure prescribed in paragraph 5 shall be followed.”.
