ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

---

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under Section 6 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974, I, the Chief Officer, hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Game (Ceiling) Order, 1980.
  2. The number of game that may be shot or possessed by the holder of a game licence on any one day shall not exceed five partridges, or four partridges and one francolin.

## THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971

(Ordinance 11 of 1971).

## THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967.

(Ordinances 9 of 1967 and 14 of 1969).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I, the Chief Police Officer and Superintendent of Prisons, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1980, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations", be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No. 60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. The Second Schedule to the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations is hereby deleted and the following substituted thereof:
