THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971

(Ordinance 11 of 1971).

THE POLICE ORDINANCE 1967

(Ordinances 9 of 1967, 14 of 1969 and 7 of 1975).

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 15
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971, READ WITH SECTION 9
OF THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967, AND SECTION 12 OF
THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967 and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I the Chief Police Officer and Superintendent of Prisons, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1981, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as “the principal Police Regulations”, be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No. 60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as “the principal Prison Officers Regulations.”.

2. Regulation 5 of the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations are each amended by deleting paragraph (g) thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph :—

“(g) shall give such information as may be required as to his previous history or employment or any other matter relating to his appointment to the Police Force and Prison Service and if any candidate, within his knowledge makes in, or in connection with, his application for appointment any false or misleading statement shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds ;”.

3. Regulation 18 of the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations are each amended by deleting paragraphs (2) and (3) thereof and substituting therefor the following two new paragraphs :—

- “(2) (a) The normal daily period of duty (including the period for refreshment referred to in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph) of a police and a prison officer shall be six hours, unless the Chief Police Officer prescribes otherwise and the normal weekly period of duty forty-two hours, and in addition any time occupied in reporting for duty at the appointed place before the tour of duty begins.
- (b) Where the normal period of duty is performed in one tour of duty, a break of thirty minutes shall normally be allowed.
- (c) This regulation shall not apply to a police or prison officer who is—
- (i) a Gazetted officer, or
- (ii) employed in duties which have been specially exempted by the Chief Police Officer.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation every police and prison officer shall, if properly called upon, or if he perceives it his duty to do so, be required to perform any duty appertaining to his office at any time, unless he is on leave, and such period of duty shall not be less than forty-two hours weekly. Inspectors and above shall have a twenty-four hour responsibility.

Extra Duty.

- (3) (a) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, where a police or a prison officer to whom paragraph (2) of this regulation applies remains on duty after his tour of duty ends or is recalled to duty between two tours of duty, he shall be granted an overtime allowance on a similar and equivalent basis as in the case of members of public service.
- (b) Where a police officer, including a police officer to whom a detective allowance is paid, and to whom paragraph (2) of this regulation applies, regularly performs overtime, a commuted allowance shall be payable to him as the Chief Police Officer may approve :

Provided that a commuted allowance shall be payable only when a police officer, to whom a detective allowance is paid, performs overtime duty over five hours weekly of the regular period of duty as prescribed in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (2) of this regulation.

4. Regulation 19 of the principal Police Regulations and the principal Prison Officers Regulations are each amended by deleting the word "six" appearing in the sixth line of paragraph (1) thereof and substituting therefor the word "seven".

5. Regulation 30 of the principal Police Regulations are amended by deleting the words "more than five hours' extra duty in excess of forty-eight hours per week on an average" appearing in the fourth and fifth lines thereof and substituting therefor the words "at least five hours in excess of the regular period of duty as provided in paragraph (2) of Regulation 18 of these Regulations."

6. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st January, 1982.

THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS
(PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974

(Ordinance 11 of 1974).

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 27 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of Section 27 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, the Area Officer Akrotiri, with the approval of the Chief Officer, hereby authorises any holder of a valid game licence to shoot, take or pursue wild birds, including such vermin as sparrows, crows, jackdaws and foxes, in the area set out in the Schedule hereto during the period commencing on Sunday the 3rd January, 1982 and ending on Sunday the 28th February, 1982 subject to the following terms and conditions:—

- (a) shooting shall take place on Sundays and Wednesdays only;
 - (b) no dogs shall be used;
 - (c) no fires shall be kindled;
 - (d) no farm or other cultivated land where there is a risk of damage being caused to fruit trees, vegetable gardens, citrus plantations, cereal crops or vineyards shall be entered;
 - (e) shot-guns shall be carried from and to the areas specified in this notice dismantled;
 - (f) hunters shall carry with them their game licence, their gun possession licence and the certificate of registration of their gun.
2. This notice may be revoked at any time.

S C H E D U L E

All that area of Episkopi village which lies within the Akrotiri Sovereign Base Area excluding any Game Reserves as marked on the ground by appropriate sign posts.
