THE PORTS ORDINANCE, 1982

(Ordinance 13 of 1982).

ORDER MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 3 of the Ports Ordinance, 1982, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ports Ordinance (Declaration of Ports) Order, 1982.

2. The place specified in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a port within the meaning of the above mentioned Ordinance.

S C H E D U L E

Akrotiri Sovereign Base Area.

The Territorial waters of the Areas contained within Latitude 34° 33' 48" North and Latitude 34° 35' 12" North on Admiralty Chart No. 846 of the 3rd February, 1939 (Plan of Limassol).

THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ORDINANCE, 1969

(Ordinances 12 of 1969, 9 of 1971, 2 of 1975,
4 of 1977 and 8 of 1977).

ORDER MADE BY THE ACTING ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTION 59 (4).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Administrator by sub-section (4) of Section 59 of the Customs and Excise Ordinance, 1969 the Acting Administrator makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) (Amendment) Order, 1982 and shall be read as one with the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Order, 1975 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by deleting paragraph 3 thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph :—

"General
reliefs.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Part—

(i) a person entering the Areas after a stay abroad of at least 72 hours who at the time when he enters is not a member of the crew of the ship or the aircraft in which he enters, shall be relieved from payment of duty on articles of the descriptions, in the quantities, to the extent and under the conditions shown in Schedule 1 (provided that in the case of tobacco products the period of 72 hours is not applicable);

Schedule 1.

(ii) a person entering the Areas who, at the time when he enters is a member of the crew of the ship or the aircraft in which he enters, shall be relieved from payment of duty on articles of the descriptions, in the quantities, to the extent and under the conditions shown in Schedule 2."

Schedule 2.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by deleting Schedule 1 thereto and substituting therefor the following new Schedule :—

"SCHEDULE 1

(Paragraph 3(i)).

GENERAL.

Description of articles	Quantities, extent and conditions of relief
Tobacco	250 grammes ;
Spirits, other than perfumed spirits	0.75 litre ;
Wine	0.75 litre ;
Perfumed spirits and toilet waters	0.30 litre, including one bottle of perfumed spirit of not more than 0.15 litre ;
Articles of any other description (except jewellery)	to a total value of £25."
