THE POLICE ORDINANCE

(Ordinances 9 of 1967, 14 of 1969 and 7 of 1975).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 23 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Section 23 (1) of the Police Ordinance, I hereby order that Waterloo Road South, from its eastern junction with the Larnaca/Famagusta Road to its junction with the Ormedhia/Dhekelia Road, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic, except for access, from 0600 hours on Monday 5.11.90 to 0600 hours on Monday 3.12.90. During this period, vehicular traffic will be diverted around Dhekelia Garrison via Larnaca/Famagusta Road and Waterloo Road North.

THE PLANT DISEASES AND
PESTS (PREVENTION AND CONTROL)
ORDINANCE

(Cap. 49 — Laws of Cyprus — and Ordinance 9 of 1978
and 9 of 1981).

ORDER UNDER SECTION 4(1).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by subsection (1) of Section 4 of the Plant Diseases and Pests (Prevention and Control) Ordinance, the Chief Officer hereby orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Diseases of Plants (Tristeza) Order, 1990.

2. In this Order—

“Authorised Officer” means any officer of the Sovereign Base Areas Administration, authorised by the Chief Officer for the purposes of this Order and includes any authorised person as provided under Section 6 of the Ordinance.

“Citrus trees” means all trees belonging to the genus of citrus and includes sweet lemons, citron^s, bitter lemons, kumquat, lumie, clementines, tangerines, lemons, pergamont, oranges, pummelos, grapefruit etc.

“Ordinance” means the Plant Diseases and Pests (Prevention and Control) Ordinance.

“Tristeza” means a citrus disease caused by a virus commonly known as “tristeza”.

3. Any owner of citrus trees or of a citrus grove or any other person having under his control such trees or grove shall:—

- (a) At the request of any authorised officer show and allow him to examine such citrus trees or citrus grove;
- (b) within the time limit specified in a notice served upon him by such authorised officer, uproot and destroy by fire all citrus trees which in the opinion of the authorised officer are infected or which the authorised officer has reasonable cause to believe that they are infected with tristeza;
- (c) secure from the Chief Officer permission, allowing him to use budwood sticks for the grafting of citrus plantations or to transfer plants, budwood sticks or any other multiplicative matter in relation to citrus trees.

4. In the event of the failure or neglect of any person to comply with the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order, the Area Officer or any officer authorised in that behalf, may act in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of Section 4 of the Ordinance.

5. Public Instrument No. 40 of 1967 is hereby revoked.

**THE POWERS AND DUTIES (OFFICERS OF THE
REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS) (CONSOLIDATION)
ORDINANCE, 1976
(Ordinance 4 of 1976).**

**ORDER MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTION 3.**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 3 of the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1976 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) (Amendment) Order, 1990 and shall be read as one with the Powers and Duties (Officers of the Republic of Cyprus) (Consolidation) Order, 1976 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”).

THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS (PROTECTION
AND DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974

(Ordinances 11 of 1974, 1 of 1982, 3 of 1985,
9 of 1988 and 20 of 1989).

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under Section 6 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974 I, the Chief Officer, hereby order as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Game (Ceiling) Order, 1990.
2. The number of hares that may be shot or possessed by the holder of a game licence shall not on any one day exceed two.
3. The number of partridges that may shot or possessed by the holder of a game licence shall not on any one day exceed five:

Provided that such holder may on any one day shoot or possess one francolin, but in such a case the number of partridges that may be shot or possessed by such holder shall not on any one day exceed four.

4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to the possession of hares, partridges or francolin by any person who is entitled to possess such game under Section 11 of the Ordinance.
5. This Order covers the period between 11th November, 1990 and 30th December, 1990 inclusive.
