NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to Public Instrument No. 180 of 1990 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette No. 920 of the 21st December, 1990, notice is hereby given that the following land is required for the undertaking of the public utility mentioned therein:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) (Maximum Price of Gravel and Sand) (Amendment) Order, 1991 and shall be read as one with the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) (Maximum Price of Gravel and Sand) Order, 1979 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”).

**CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICE ORDER
MADE UNDER SECTIONS 3 (1) AND 4 (1).**

In exercise of the powers vested in him by subsection (1) of Sections 3 and 4 of the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) Ordinance, the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) (Maximum Price of Eggs) Order, 1991.
2. Eggs are hereby declared to be a controlled commodity for the purpose of the Ordinance.
3. The wholesale and retail prices at which eggs may be sold or offered for sale in the Areas shall not exceed the maximum prices set out in the second and third columns respectively of the Schedule hereto.
4. Public Instrument No. 59 of 1988 is hereby revoked.
