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**REGULATIONS MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR  
UNDER SECTION 18.**

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In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 18 of the Social Insurance (Facilitation of Republican Social Insurance Scheme) Ordinance, 1980 the Administrator hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Contributions) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1992 and shall be read as one with the Social Insurance (Contributions) Regulations, 1980 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”).

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the new Schedule appearing in the Appendix to these Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 13th day of January, 1992.

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THE FOOD HYGIENE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1989.

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APPOINTMENT OF FOOD HYGIENE CONTROLLER UNDER  
REGULATION 3 (1).

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In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph 1 of regulation 3 of the Food Hygiene (General) Regulations, 1989, the Administrator hereby appoints S.M. Leonard Esquire, to be the Food Hygiene Controller and to exercise the powers and perform the duties conferred or imposed by the said Regulations.

**No. 19****THE COMMODITIES AND SERVICES (REGULATION  
AND CONTROL) ORDINANCE**

10 of 1972 and 10 of 1982).

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**CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICE ORDER  
MADE UNDER SECTIONS 3 (1) AND 4 (1).**

In exercise of the powers vested in him by subsection (1) of Sections 3 and 4 of the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) Ordinance, 1962 the Administrator hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Commodities and Services (Regulation and Control) (Maximum Price of Pork) Order, 1992.
2. Pork is hereby declared to be a controlled commodity for the purpose of the Ordinance.
3. The wholesale and retail prices at which pork may be sold or offered for sale in the Areas shall not exceed the maximum prices set out in the second and third columns respectively of the Schedule hereto.
4. Public Instrument No. 103 of 1989 is hereby revoked.

**No. 21****THE POLICE ORDINANCE**

(Ordinances 9 of 1967, 14 of 1969 and 7 of 1975).

**THE PRISONS ORDINANCE**

(Ordinances 11 of 1971, 7 of 1975 and 2 of 1985).

**REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 15  
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1971, READ WITH SECTION 9  
OF THE POLICE ORDINANCE, 1967 AND SECTION 12  
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971, read with Section 9 of the Police Ordinance, 1967 and Section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1971 I, the Chief Police Officer with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations :-

38/68, 6, 57 and  
64/69, 41/70, 66/71,  
15/73, 10 and 13/74,  
38, 44 and 50/75,  
87/76, 48 and 60/77,  
28, 42 and 85/79,  
16, 44 and 76/80,

22/82, 54/82, 54/83,  
28/85, 83/86, 48/87,  
34/88, 64/90, 46/91  
and 47/91.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) Regulations, 1992, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967 as amended from time to time, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations", be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations, 1967, as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No. 60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting Regulation 7 thereof and substituting therefor the following new Regulation :-

"7.-(1) No member of the Force other than a special constable appointed under subsection (1) of Section 30 of the Police Ordinance, 1967, shall be at liberty to resign from the Force unless expressly permitted to do so by the Chief Police Officer, and in the case of Gazetted Officers, with the approval of the Administrator :

Provided that, in normal circumstances -

- (a) one month's notice will be required from members of the Force other than Gazetted Officers; and
- (b) three months' notice will be required from Gazetted Officers:

Provided further that the period of notice may be less if acceptable to the Chief Police Officer with the approval of the Administrator.

(2) The Chief Police Officer may, with the approval of the Administrator, discharge any member of the Force, other than Gazetted Officers, at any time during the period of his engagement -



- (a) on medical evidence to the satisfaction of the Administrator under any legislation in force for the time being, relating to the retirement of such police officer;
- (b) on reduction of establishment;
- (c) on conviction in respect of an offence of dishonesty or immorality or in respect of an offence for which imprisonment exceeding six months is applicable;
- (d) where the Legal Adviser confirms that the public interest so demands :

Provided that prior to his discharge under sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) of this paragraph, the member of the Force shall be entitled to present his case for hearing by the Chief Police Officer.

(REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS) (RECOGNITION)  
ORDINANCE, 1979.**

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**REGULATIONS MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR UNDER  
SECTIONS 9 AND 15.**

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In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Sections 9 and 15 of the Industrial Training Authority (Republic of Cyprus) (Recognition) Ordinance, 1979, the Administrator hereby makes the following Regulations :—

P.Is. Nos. 39/79,  
87/79, 102/80, 49/83,  
38/84, 18/85, 39/86,  
22/88, 28/88, 22/89,  
48/90 and 30/91.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Industrial Training Authority (Employers' Levy) (Amendment) Regulations, 1992 and shall be read as one with the Industrial Training Authority (Employers' Levy) Regulations, 1979 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the first proviso to paragraph (1) thereof and substituting therefor the following new proviso :—

"Provided that no levy shall be payable in respect of any part of wages exceeding two hundred and twenty eight pounds weekly or nine hundred and eighty eight pounds monthly."

3. These Regulations shall come into effect on the 1st March, 1992.
