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No. 14**THE POLICE ORDINANCE**

(Ordinances 9 of 1967, 14 of 1969, 7 of 1975, 2 of 1993
10 of 1998 and 25 of 1999)

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 23(1)

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 23(1) of the Police Ordinance, I, the Chief Constable, hereby order that part of Waterloo Road South between Permanent Vehicle Check Point (E) and Permanent Vehicle Check Point (W) shall be closed to all vehicular traffic from 1600 hours on Thursday 1 June 2000 until 2359 hours on the same day, and from 1600 hours on Friday 2 June 2000 to 2359 hours on the same day. Vehicular traffic travelling on the above road will be diverted through Waterloo Road North on both dates.

**REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 15
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE 1971, READ WITH SECTION 9
OF THE POLICE ORDINANCE 1967 AND SECTION 12
OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (2) of section 15 of the Prisons Ordinance, read with section 9 of the Police Ordinance, and section 12 of the Prisons Ordinance, I, the Chief Constable, with the approval of the Administrator, hereby make the following Regulations:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police and Prison Officers (General) (Amendment) Regulations 2000, and shall, where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations 1967, as amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Police Regulations"), be read as one with those Regulations, and where they apply to the Police (General) Regulations as modified by paragraph 2 and Appendix II of Public Instrument No.60 of 1971 and thereby made applicable to, and made to relate to, the service of prison officers, be read as one with such Regulations as so modified, which are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Prison Officers Regulations".

2. Regulation 2 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical order the following new definitions:

"day" means a period of 24 hours commencing at such time or times as the Chief Constable shall fix and the Chief Constable may fix different times in relation to different groups of members of the Force; "

"week" means a period of seven consecutive days as defined hereinbefore leading to a total of 52 weeks in a calendar year, each such week beginning on a Monday."

3. Regulation 18 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:

(a) by deleting sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (2) thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph:

"(a) The normal daily period of duty (including the period for refreshment referred to in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph) of a police and a prison officer shall be eight hours, unless the Chief Constable prescribes otherwise, and the normal weekly period of duty forty hours (2085 hours per year), and in addition any time occupied in reporting for duty and inspection and receiving instructions relative to the tour of duty at the appointed place.";

- (b) by deleting the words "thirty minutes" appearing in line two of paragraph (2)(b) thereof and substituting therefor the words "forty five minutes for refreshment.";
- (c) by deleting the words "forty two" appearing in line six of paragraph (2)(d) thereof and substituting therefor the word "forty".

Regulation 19 of the principal Regulations amended.

4. Regulation 19 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (1) thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph:

"(1) All police officers (in the case of the principal Police Regulations) and all prison officers (in the case of the principal Prison Officers Regulations) to whom paragraph (2) of Regulation 18 of these Regulations applies, shall be granted, subject to the exigencies of the Service, leave hereinafter referred to as "rest day leave" at the rate of two rest days in respect of each week."

Regulation 20 of the principal Regulations amended.

5. Regulation 20 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) by deleting the figure "42" appearing in line two of paragraph (2) and the figure "3.5" in line three thereof and substituting therefor the figures "29" and "2.4" respectively;
- (b) by deleting the figure "3.5" appearing in line two of paragraph (8) thereof and substituting therefor the figure "2.4"; and
- (c) by deleting the figure "3.5" appearing in line two of paragraph (a) thereof and substituting therefor the figure "2.4".

New Regulation 25A inserted to the principal Regulations.

6. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by inserting immediately after Regulation 25 thereof the following new Regulation to be numbered 25A:

"Shift allowance.

25A.- (1) All members of the Force who work shift hours shall be granted a shift allowance as laid down from time to time in SBA Police Routine Orders.

(2) The shift allowance referred to in paragraph (1) shall be reckoned on a monthly basis.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) where a member of the Force who is entitled to a shift allowance is also entitled to a rent allowance in accordance with Regulation 26, then only the higher of the two allowances shall be paid to him."

No. 17**THE FORESHORE PROTECTION ORDINANCE 1975**

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 3(1).
