
**PROTECTION AND WELFARE OF ANIMALS (TRANSPORT) (REVOCATION)
REGULATIONS 2009**

The Administrator makes the following Regulations in exercise of his powers under sections 11(2), 22(1) and 22(2)(b) of the Protection and Welfare of Animals Ordinance 2001(a).

Citation and Commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Protection and Welfare of Animals (Transport) (Revocation) Regulations 2009 and come into force on the day they are published in the Gazette.

Revocation of Public Instruments No. 141/2004 and No. 26/2005

2. The Protection and Welfare of Animals (Transport) Regulations 2004(b) and the Protection and Welfare of Animals (Transport) (Amendment) Regulations 2005(c) are revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

Introduction

1. This explanatory note relates to the Protection and Welfare of Animals (Transport) (Revocation) Regulations 2008 (“the Regulations”). It has been prepared by the Office of the Attorney General and Legal Adviser in order to assist the reader of the Regulations. It does not form part of the Regulations.

Particular points

2. The Regulations provide for the revocation in the Areas of two Public Instruments (“the SBA PIs”) which adopted Republican Public Instruments on the transport of animals. The Republican Public Instruments were themselves revoked by Republican Public Instrument 273/08 published in the Republican Gazette on 18 July 2008. From that date, the SBA PIs ceased to have effect in the Areas in accordance with s.2(3) of the Adopted Instruments Ordinance 2003 (Ordinance 15/03 as amended by Ordinance 36/03). The SBA PIs are now formally revoked.

3. The transport of animals in the Areas is now regulated by EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 on the protection of animals during transport and related operations.
