**MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC (ROAD CLOSURE) (SNAKE ROAD)
ORDER 2012**

The Chief Officer makes the following Order in exercise of the powers under section 13A(1)(a) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Consolidation) Ordinance 2006.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Road Closure) (Snake Road) Order 2012 and comes into force on publication in the Gazette.

Prohibition on the use of Snake Road

2. All vehicles are prohibited at all times from using the part of the Larnaca to Famagusta road known as the Snake Road between the Waterloo Road West roundabout and the junction of the Larnaca to Famagusta main road with the Pyla to Pergamos road in the Dhekelia Sovereign Base Area.

Expiry

3. This Order expires at 11 a.m. on 17 October 2012.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

1. This explanatory note relates to the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Road Closure) (Snake Road) Order 2012 (the “Order”). It has been prepared by the Office of the Attorney General and Legal Adviser in order to assist the reader of the Order.
2. The Order is made under section 13A of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Consolidation) Ordinance 2006. Section 13A permits the Chief Officer to make an Order prohibiting vehicles from using a road for such period of time as may be specified in the Order.
3. The Order prohibits vehicles from using Snake Road in the Dhekelia Sovereign Base Area.
4. The Order remains in force until 11 a.m. on 17 October 2012, when Snake Road will reopen.
5. A person who contravenes the Order commits an offence and is liable to imprisonment for 2 years and a fine of €1,708 or both.
