
EXPORT OF CURRENCY (RESTRICTIVE MEASURES) (CONTINUATION NO. 3) ORDER 2015

The Chief Officer makes the following Order in exercise of the powers in sections 2(3) and 5(9) of the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (No. 5) Ordinance 2013(a)

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (Continuation No. 3) Order 2015.

Commencement

2. This Order comes into force at 11.59 pm on 30 March 2015.

Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (No. 5) Ordinance 2013 continues in force

3. The Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (No. 5) Ordinance 2013 continues in force and expires at the end of 20 April 2015.

Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (Continuation No. 2) Order 2015 revoked

4. The Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (Continuation No. 2) Order 2015(b) is revoked.

Savings

5. Despite the revocation made by article 4, the amendment to section 5 (export of banknotes) of the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (No. 5) Ordinance 2013 made by article 5 of the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (Continuation) Order 2015(c) continues to have effect.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

1. This explanatory note relates to the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (Continuation No. 3) Order 2015 (the “Order”). It has been prepared by the Office of the Attorney-General and Legal Adviser in order to assist the reader of the Order.
2. The Order provides that the Export of Currency (Restrictive Measures) (No. 5) Ordinance 2013 should continue in force until the end of 20 April 2015, with a limit of €10,000 on the value of banknotes which may be exported by a person leaving the Areas via a customs airport or customs port without the permission of the Fiscal Officer continuing to have effect.
